

August – Log Cabin Block

“There once was a quiltmaker who kept a house in the blue misty mountains up high. the oldest great, great grandfather could not recall a time when she was not up there, away day after day.... The blues seemed to come from the deepest part of the Ocean whites from the northernmost snows, the greens and purples from the wildflowers, the oranges and pinks from the most wonderful sunsets!”

Block size = 9”

Fabric Requirements: (For 1 Block)

Lightest: B & C (can be the same or different).

Light: F & G (can be the same or different).

Medium Light: J & K (can be the same or different).

Dark Light: N & O (can be the same or different).

Red Center: A

Medium: D & E (can be the same or different).

Medium Dark: H & I (can be the same or different).

Dark: L & M (can be the same or different).

Darkest: P & Q (can be the same or different).

Cutting Instructions: CUT (1) OF EACH PIECE

B = 1 ½ x 1 ½ ”

C = 1 ½ x 2 ½ ”

F = 1 ½ x 3 ½ ”

G = 1 ½ x 4 ½ ”

J = 1 ½ x 5 ½ ”

K = 1 ½ x 6 ½ ”

N = 1 ½ x 7 ½ ”

O = 1 ½ x 8 ½ ”

A = 1 ½ x 1 ½ ”

D = 1 ½ x 2 ½ ”

E = 1 ½ x 3 ½ ”

H = 1 ½ x 4 ½ ”

I = 1 ½ x 5 ½ ”

L = 1 ½ x 6 ½ ”

M = 1 ½ x 7 ½ ”

P = 1 ½ x 8 ½ ”

Q = 1 ½ x 9 ½ ”

1 Sew Piece A to Piece B. Press.

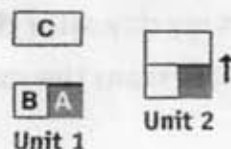
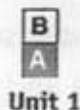
2 Sew Piece C to the top of Unit 1 as shown.

Read all the instructions before you begin.

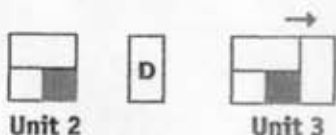
Always place right sides of fabric together for stitching.

Use scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.

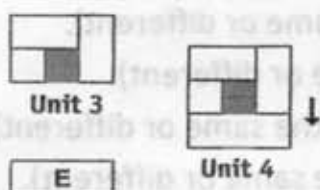
Press seam allowances in the direction of arrows.



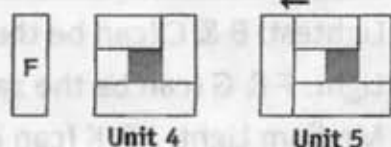
3 Sew Piece D to the right side of Unit 2. Press.



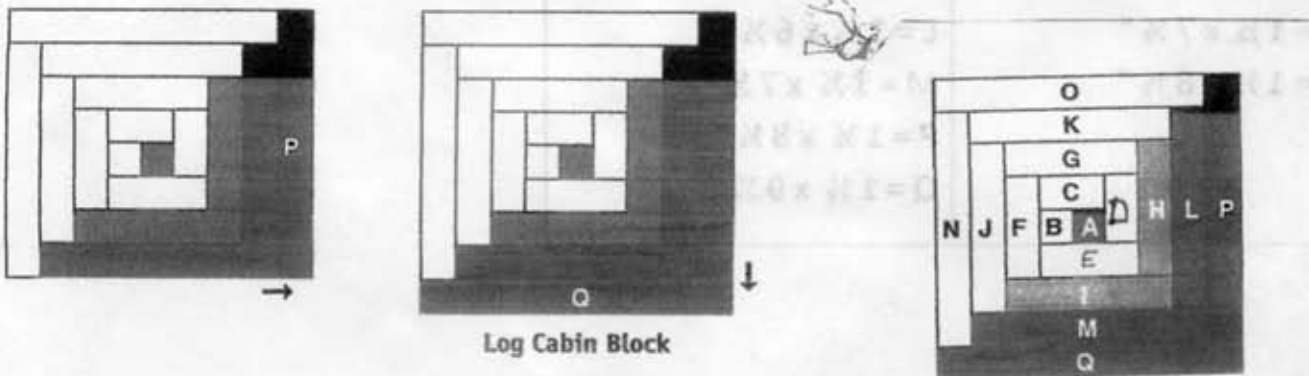
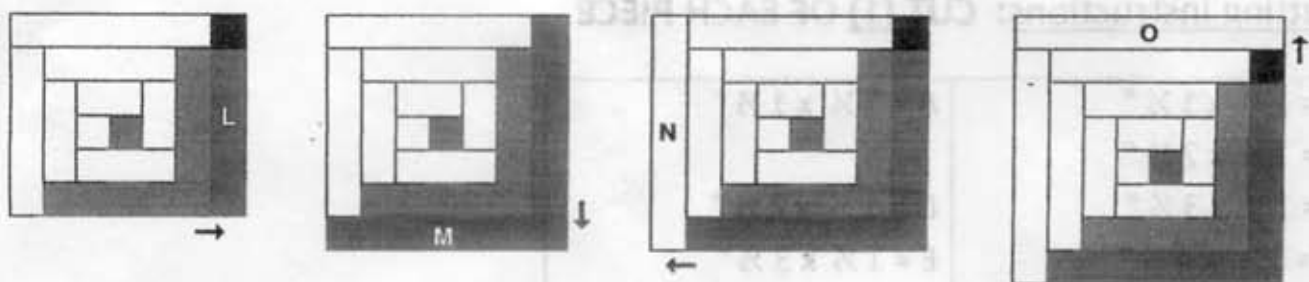
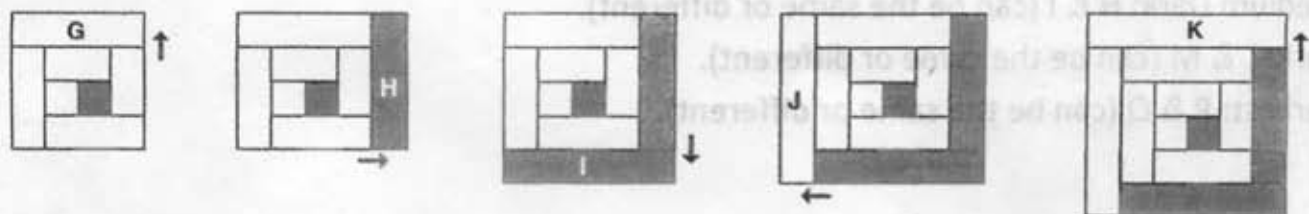
4 Sew Piece E to the bottom of Unit 3. Press.



5 Sew Piece F to the left side of Unit 4. Press.



6 Continue to sew the log pieces clock-wise until you have four rounds on each side of the center red square. Press away from the center each time you add a log.
